« What are the end of life and palliative care needs, including assisted dying, of older Indigenous and non-Indigenous LGBTQI+ adults in Aotearoa New Zealand ? »

Tess Moeke-Maxwell will present evidence from a current study on New Zealand Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Queer, Intersex, + (LGBTQI+) and Takataapui older adults' views and preferences for end of life, palliative care, and assisted dying. International research indicates that older Rainbow community members, due to historical trauma and other issues, may be reluctant to access palliative care and assisted dying services in older age. However, little research exists documenting LGBTQI+ and takataapui older adults views in New Zealand. Therefore, the purpose of the study has been to identify LGBTQI+ priorities and preferences for palliative and end of life care including the recent option of assisted dying.
